Ship's Store – the Great Shirt Sell-Off

Prior to the 2004 reunion in San Antonio, we decided to open a Ship's Store to sell quality memorabilia and wearing apparel with the VP-2 name, logo or patch design to our members. Since then, we've sold untold numbers of T-shirts, golf shirts, sweat shirts, ball caps and visors, patches, lighters, lapel pins and coffee mugs. It is easy and fairly inexpensive to stock the non-apparel items because there are no sizes and colors to worry about. Stocking the shirts is a different matter since a proper store has to carry all the sizes, colors and styles that our members might order, and it is very expensive to maintain all those items in stock. Now that many of our members have purchased one or more shirts, the demand for shirts has fallen off. It just isn't worth the expense and trouble to continue maintaining all those shirts in the Ship's Store inventory. So, all shirts must go. Once they are gone, they will not be reordered.

Now, it isn't easy selling the remaining shirts by mail order because we're already running out of some colors and sizes, and you won't know which styles, colors and sizes we still have in stock. **You can't wait to buy your shirts at the reunion because we aren't going to sell shirts at the reunion. In fact, we probably aren't going to sell any of our products at the reunion.** It costs too much to ship everything to the reunion site... we'd have to jack up the prices in order to do that. Plus, we would have to have one or more people give up their reunion time to man the store (as we did in San Antonio). We will probably have a display at the reunion of all the items we're selling in the Ship's Store so that you can see what they look like, then order them by mail. If you want a shirt or a ball cap for the reunion, you'll need to order it now by mail.



We're keeping running totals of shirt availability on the VP-2 website at www.patron2.com so that those who are Internet capable can check available shirt sizes and colors before they order. These people should email me at vicgulliver@comcast.net and ask

me to set their shirts aside until their checks arrive. For those who cannot check availability on the website, you are invited to call me at 847-296-6907. I will tell you if we have your desired shirt size in stock, and I will set it (or them) aside for you until your check and mail order form arrive in the mail.

We're putting the Ship's Store mail-order form in this Newsletter with special annotations to show what colors and sizes are available as of the deadline for putting the Newsletter together. Those numbers will change before you receive this Newsletter in the mail, so call or email me before you try to order anything. Obviously, the most popular colors and sizes will sell-out first. We are already out of some colors and sizes. We do have a number of Small and Medium sized shirts that might not fit some of our members, but might fit a grandchild. These shirts are a great bargain and would make terrific presents.

Thank you for supporting the Ship's Store. We look forward to your orders.

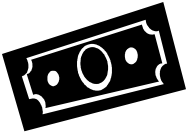

Maybe you needed more information. Let me fill in a few gaps. Arriving Monday afternoon we will meet in the Ready Room for an informal reception with light snacks. This is a time for hugs, kisses and "Guess who that is". Name tags will help if the ole eye balls still work. Whidbey Patrol Squadron Memorial

The Whidbey Patrol Squadron Memorial is right on track. The contract for the bronze Airman has been let, and the sculptor, Michael Maiden, has already completed a miniature mockup and is now in the process of making a full-scale wax model. The wax model will become the basis for casting the bronze statue. Michael Maiden provided the statues for the EA-6 Memorial on Ault Field and has just completed a six-statue Naval Aviation memorial at Virginia Beach.

The contract for the granite Memorial Wall has been let with Quiring Monuments of Seattle. The granite will come, cut and polished, from India. Quiring will then etch our material in the granite. The Committee has been editing, and rechecking the data. We have stressed accuracy in our data, as we don't want bum dope etched into the granite. That is one of the reasons that we have only P2V casualties listed on the Memorial Wall. To gather accurate data covering all Whidbey VP squadrons would be a life-long venture.

Kenadar will take our brick and tile order in May and deliver the inscribed bricks to the site for installation in August. We plan to accept brick orders at the dedication, and Kenadar will come up and etch those bricks as they lay in the patio. We have orders for over 455 commemorative bricks for our veterans, a few from the community, and only a few 9-inch commemorative tiles (major donors) for the walkway. We have room for just over 200 more veteran bricks to still stay within our 20'x20' limit agreed upon with the Parks Board.

We have visited with Krieg Construction, which has volunteered to "build" the site. Krieg will "build" the site to a certain point, and then another contractor will install the bricks and tiles. Working

with the Kriegs has been a real breather, and what a kick. Karl and his son, Jim, just take over any conversation on the building. They know just exactly what needs to be done. To be noted here is that Hank Nydam, from the Oak Harbor Parks Department Board, is working right along with us on this project.

We are getting into the dedication planning phase of the project. We are investigating the idea of engaging a professional to manage the dedication. We have met with Christine Taylor who has struck a chord with the Committee. While we will have many inputs and taskings, she will do the legwork. We are working on the dedication program, preparing a brick layout diagram so that visitors at the dedication will be able to find their bricks, and working up an address list for sending out invitations. Our formal invitation will be sent to all non-VP-2 donors and to others with an interest in the Memorial. A version of that invitation can be found elsewhere in this Newsletter. Bob Wolfe has agreed to be our Master of Ceremonies at the dedication. We are expecting the Commodore of the VP Wing to speak at the dedication.

So, we are on track. We are working with Bob Wolfe's excellent reunion committee. Bob has sat in on most of our Committee meetings, and we have sat in on some of his reunion committee meetings. Since this newsletter will be your last reminder, be advised that it isn't too late to order a commemorative brick to be laid in the patio, but bricks ordered after May 20th may not be etched in time for the September dedication. For deep-rooted procrastinators (who come to the dedication), we will take brick orders at the dedication for Kenadar's on-scene brick-etching at a later date. We hope to see you all at the reunion and dedication.

Note that the Memorial Committee is still seeking information about the next of kin or families of those deceased airmen who will be honored on the Memorial. If anyone knows the whereabouts of any relatives of those airmen, or even a hometown or anything we can use to search for these people, please let Al Hall [541-371-8482] or Dave Bowen [360-675-5708] know immediately.

Chaplain's Corner — Doug Millar

What is it that we treasure? I am writing this column two days after Easter and we have just been through an unusual weekend here in the US. We have observed the celebration of Easter, and most of us have also paid our taxes to the IRS on this same weekend. What, you may rightfully ask, do these two things have to do with each other?

I find that the two events serve well as a test to ask myself, "What is it that I treasure? Eternal, spiritual, long lasting things? Or material, monetary, temporal things? It is a question that each of us needs to ask of ourselves. Why? Because the Bible tells us that Jesus Christ said "Wherever your treasure is, there your heart and thoughts will also be . . . No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." Matthew 6 verses 21-24.

Personally I find this to be challenging because it seems such a natural thing to be concerned with monetary and material matters. After all, our lives require material things constantly just to survive. But, what of life after death? The Bible tells us in Hebrews 9:27 that "It is appointed for men to die once, and after this comes judgment." With the passing of every day, each of us draws closer to that event.

As I observe the coming and going of people everywhere, it seems that we fall into two groups — those who care about their "after-life" destinies, and those who don't. This is sad because the Bible teaches us that our eternal futures will be determined by our choices in *this* life. Now is the time to accept the free offer of eternal life, which Christ is offering to us. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me." John 14:6. This seems like a very strong and narrow statement, and indeed it is. But Christ said it. He also claimed to be God, on Earth, in human form. He was either insane; a bold-faced liar; or telling the truth. Each of us has to choose *which* it is that we believe. If we choose to believe the latter, then we need to live our lives accordingly. His spirit will help us to do exactly

that if we will just humble ourselves and ask. Jesus said, "...he who hears My Word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into life." John 5:24
