We need a new Executive Committee Member. Consider getting involved.



Floyd D. Palmer (1944-2021)

A remembrance by Vic Gulliver





Skip ahead to my first VP-2 Association reunion in 1996 in Oak Harbor where I reunited with several former crewmembers including Floyd. I hadn't seen those guys in 33 years. Floyd took me aside and gave me a brief synopsis of how the Navy, his VP-2 tour, and his time in our flight crew had turned his life completely around for the better. He was forever grateful for the unexpected opportunities that began in VP-2. Years later, he asked me to proof-read his autobiography, which I did.

Floyd came from humble if not tragic beginnings. Floyd was a troubled youth whose life was made immeasurably better by joining the Navy and learning a skill. He made the most of his squadron training to get a follow-on job as an airline mechanic. Before too long, Floyd and his wife, Lois had branched out to buy and salvage a small failed school bus company. With many years of hard work and clever business skills, that bus company grew into a major industry in Minnesota.

At the 1998 reunion in San Jose, Floyd was unanimously elected to be president of our Association. He served in that post for the next sixteen years. During those years, we did more than just have biannual reunions. We created the Whidbey Patrol Squadron Memorial (WPSM). We raised the funds to restore the world's most famous patrol aircraft, the Truculent Turtle. We have funded numerous college scholarship grants for military personnel and their dependents. Floyd wanted a more professional looking VP-2 Newsletter, so he arranged for a publisher and personally paid to have the Newsletter professionally printed and mailed to the members. During his time in office, our Association membership grew from under 200 to more than 600 members.

Floyd came up with the idea of sponsoring a P2V-7 display at the main gate to Ault Field, so he tasked Don Hanson to form a committee to work on that project. That concept became unfeasible, so it was reimagined as a memorial that eventually became the Whidbey Patrol Squadron Memorial. The WPSM wall shows the names of 86 people who perished in P2V crashes. We raised most of the money to pay for the memorial by selling inscribed bricks for the memorial floor at \$200 each. Everyone whose name appears on the wall also has an inscribed brick on the floor. Floyd made sure of that. He purchased a brick for every victim who didn't otherwise have one. He didn't want that to be known, but now you know. Floyd was also very generous when we were raising money for the Truculent Turtle.

Floyd was only 78 when he passed away. He had retired from the bus business, leaving the operation of the company to their daughter, Holly. But he remained on the Executive Board of the VP-2 Association. Buses were his business, but he never lost his gratitude to the Navy or his love of country. Wherever Floyd has gone, he's probably working on making it better.

VP 2 Reunion 2022



As we said previously, we have made arrangements with Beach Bum Trolleys in Pensacola to be our reunion planners for Reunion 2022. Working with them we have selected a hotel experienced in hosting military reunions for groups our size and accommodating our needs, including the Ready Room. We have arranged for many events, some included in the basic reunion and several optional tours and a dinner. The reunion will start on October 31 with check in and welcome reception and end with the banquet on November 3 with checkout on November 4.

Where will we stay?

The hotel we have selected will be transitioned to a Choice Comfort Inn by October. It is currently a Rodeway, also a Choice brand. It will not have a bar. However there is a liquor store within a three minute walk. For those eligible, the Navy Package Store is less than a ten minute drive away at Corry Field.



A plus is the Ready Room. It is located in the Phase II Building where we will have 30 rooms. We will have beer, soft drinks and water along with snacks and coffee available for you.

You may book the hotel room immediately. You will not be charged until you arrive and occupy the room. The room is \$95 plus tax per night and may be reserved by calling 850-455-4561 at any time. Tell

What will you be able to do?

Beach Bum Trolleys have arranged a number of events for us. Included with your registration is a Welcome event at the hotel with a Fish Fry (includes chicken for those who do not eat fish) on October 31. The regis-

tration also includes the banquet on November 3 and, of course, the Ready Room. The registration fee is \$130. This is per person.



Beach Bum has set up several optional events for us. Tour #1 will be on November 1. Those who sign up for this will take a trolley to the Naval Air Station to watch the Blue Angels practice and then continue through the flight line to the Naval Air Museum where we can tour the displays and have lunch at the Cubi Bar and Café. The cost is \$55 per person.

On November 2, you will have a choice of optional tours. Tour # 2 is the Dolphin Tour. This tour will take you around Pensacola Bay and may allow you to see the Blue Angels practice from over the water. This tour includes lunch. The cost is \$55 per person





Tour #3 is of historic downtown Pensacola. This will take you by many historic sites, including a stop at Veteran's Memorial Park, and ends with lunch at McGuire's Irish Pub. The cost for this tour is \$55 per person.

Tour #4 is an optional activity for a BBQ dinner at the hotel on November 2. This will be a wonderful southern dinner. The cost of the dinner is \$30 per person

Chaplain's Corner by Doug Millar

For many weeks now we have been bombarded with live TV coverage of the war in Ukraine. We are shocked and sickened daily by the carnage; the inhumanity; the vileness; the wickedness of this unprovoked and evil war of the Russian President Putin against his neighbor in the Ukraine. We are seeing horrendous images and cruelty that we have rarely seen since World War 2 and Vietnam. This sort of thing has gone on in other places, but not in such an open and large-scale manner.

You may ask, "What is going on? This is the 21st Century! The world is now more civilized and we're supposed to be beyond these kinds of atrocities!" Really? Have you checked the streets of Chicago lately? With all of our education and knowledge we <u>should</u> be more civilized, but we seem to be going in the opposite direction: road rage; homicides at historic levels; child abuse; open shoplifting with no consequences; open borders; total disregard of legal authority; no concern or regard for truth.

How has this happened? I believe that it is the result of removing God from the public arena. Russia has officially been under an atheistic government for over 100 years. In America we have steadily removed God from our culture for the past 50 years. When God is removed we soon find His values and guidance for our lives eroding, and soon His influence is all but eradicated. Then we become our own gods and we individually begin to determine what is truth and what is not; what is acceptable and what is not. It is not a long trip from there to utter chaos and anarchy. Does this sound familiar to our present situation in America?

The humanist philosophy of the last few hundred years has tried to convince us that our human nature is good, and that our environment and experience are the things that cause some of us to become bad as we age. This sounds nice but it is in direct contrast to the teachings of the Bible, which is God's instruction manual for mankind.

The Bible tells us that each of us is born with a "sin nature" and that nature leads us in directions away from God and his values. Did anyone have to teach us to lie, or to envy, or to lust, or to be full of pride? No. It is in our very nature to do so, and it results in separating us from our Holy God. We read in Isaiah 59:2, "Your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not

hear." Romans 3:23 says "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

But God, because of His love for each of us, has provided a bridge across this separation — that being Jesus Christ, who being perfect and sinless was able to die a substitutionary death on our behalf. This was necessary because "The wages of sin is death …" Romans 6:23. Later we read in 1 Peter 3:18, "For Christ died for sins once for all, the just for the unjust, in order that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit." All of us are familiar with John 3:16 which says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life."

But, like any gift, you must receive it to make it of any use to you. John 1:12 says "But as many as received Him to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name." If you have never done so, take a moment wherever you are right now to tell God that you accept His gift of eternal life and open your life to Christ.

So, where do we go from here? Clearly our nation and our world seem to be going in the wrong direction – heading toward Hell on earth, and Hell in eternity. We as individuals may not be able to change the direction of our culture, but God is in the business of changing lives, one life at a time He wants to work in each of our lives, and the fact is that each of us has influence in our own little circle. Who knows – if we can make a change in our circle of influence it may make a change in someone else who moves in other circles, and ultimately change the direction of our culture. "If my people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray, and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." 2 Chronicles 7:14.

It all sounds too good and too easy to be true. But it is true! Jesus said, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:32
